

USC freshmen Nicole Leimbach USC freshmen Nicole Leimbach and Lindsey Nelson were named as ITA Singles All-Americans on Friday. No. 8 Leimbach was the Pacific-10 player of the year and finished with a 32-10 record in singles play. She lost in the first round of the NCAA Women's Tennis Singles Championships. No. 16 Nelson ended the season with a 35-8 record and advanced to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Championships.

By being named an ITA All-American, sophomore Jamil Al-Agba became the first men's tennis player to receive such an accolade since

2002. Al-Agba, whose No. 20 individual ranking garnered the honor, made it to the second round of the singles tournament and doubles competi-tion with senior Johan Berg, Al-Agba was also selected to the Pac-10 sec-ond team.
