

# Teens wipe out Women of Troy in exhibition, 4-0

LOS ANGELES (U-WIRE) -- The USC women's soccer team faced off against the U.S. Under-19 National Team at the Home Depot Center in Carson Tuesday afternoon in lieu of normal practice. The Women of Troy were shut out, 4-0.

"I didn't really want to play (the girls) too much today," USC coach Jim Millinder said, citing the team's road trip to Tallahassee, Fla., last weekend, and the game against Hawaii on Friday.

"It was a good training game for us," Millinder said. "We played our starters for the first half, and everybody on our team played today. It gives everybody a chance to play against a high-level opponent."

Defender Hillary Schwarzbach will miss the season after tearing her ACL during the Rhode Island game on Friday.

"We'll petition for her to get another year of eligibility," Millinder said.

Defender Nikki Goza was granted a fourth year of eligibility on the grounds of "hardship," and will play Friday.

Two years ago Goza sustained a season-ending injury and underwent three surgeries to restore her health.

"We petitioned the Pac-10 to get a fourth year of actual playing back," Millinder said. "She got the votes necessary. She got cleared, so she'll be able to play."
